Tamil Community walkathon steps up again

A warm community spirit matched the sunny weather on May 25, when over 300 registered walkers and their supporters took part in the second annual Baby Steps Walkathon in support of the Birthing and Newborn Centre at Rouge Valley Centenary, scheduled to open in October.

The Baby Steps Walkathon was again organized by the Canadian Tamil Community. The walk from the Malvern Town Centre to Rouge Valley Centenary led to a post-event ceremony with Sri Lankan music and dance.

In total, \$17,300 was raised. Many thanks to everyone who participated: walkers, volunteers, event Chair and Foundation Board member Kula Sellathurai, Labour of Love Campaign Chair and master of ceremonies Beverly Thomson, and special guests Scarborough-Rouge River MPP Bas Balkissoon, Toronto city Councilor Raymond Cho and Pon Balarajan from the Canadian Tamil Congress.

Janet Ecker, newly-appointed Chair of Rouge Valley Health System, was speaking with long-time friends Gord and Ann Moore when the topic of Centenary's soon-to-be-opened Birthing and Newborn Centre came up. It turned out that the couple had a strong personal interest in the new facility.

A few years ago, when Gord's son Jay and his wife Tanya were expecting, she experienced complications. Tanya was air lifted to Windsor, where she stayed for 10 days, then air

lifted back to Toronto, delivering her son at a local hospital. Three days later, baby Owen was transferred to Rouge Valley Centenary, where he stayed for three weeks in the current Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Gord and Ann learned that, when the Birthing and Newborn Centre opens this fall, the brand new Advanced Level II NICU will make Rouge Valley's level of care the best in the region. "Life would have been
